	The object of this mission is to develop as many human resources below as possible in order to make this area a good place to live with mutual help.

	JCI Handa was aware of the importance of the relationship again that you can help each other after the Great East Japan Earthquake. We has been believing that its local society can turn into the good place to live by incorporating the policy above.
	The area on which JCI Handa is based contains a lot of communities in which the residents are able to support each other due to organizations to hold local festivals in each community. More and more residents in the communities, however, are gradually becoming able to lead their life without supporting each other because of the recent lifestyle diversfied ar modernized. We found it extremely important to develop as many human resources, especially from children, as possible.
Overview :	JCI Handa had the children carry out the program through which the children help each other. The children found it enjoyable and pleasant to help each other at the
	We help the children make it to Positive Change by turning them into the ones who can support each other. Finally, We succeeded in offering the children some chances to share the
	experience above with their friends.
	We had the participants, who all were children, walk 77 kilometers together for three days.
	We gave the children some requests at an appropriate time in order for them to carry out mutual help.
	We divided the children into several teams. We and some volunteers from the local citizens helped the teams carry out the program.
	<ul> <li>Day 1. We had the children know each member of the team that he/she belonged to(mutual understanding, compassion).</li> <li>Day 2. We gave the children some requests for them to help their team members, and had them look back on how they felt after the taking actions.</li> <li>Day 3. We provided the children with some opportunities that the children could help each other(do your duty).</li> </ul>
Results :	A month later. We put on a meeting in which the children show each other how much they helped others in their life after the program. Each of the children could help the other team members who joined the program. Each of the children could behave properly toward their family members or friends in their daily life thinking of them on the other side.

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Each of the children could decide to keep thinking of the others around them in the future. We managed to develop more children who could take an act to help the others.

Excerptions from the participants survey results

- 1. 99 percent children found it important to support each other while walking 77 kilometers, and 76 percent out of the 99 percent children showed 'I understood the importance very much' in their answers.
- 93 percent children showed in their answers that they became able to take actions to help others in their daily life after they joined the program.
- 3. 99 percent children showed in their answers that they would keep helping others in the future.

## Excerptions from the parents of the participants survey results

1. 83 percent parents showed in their answers that they be care aware of some acts that the children took that they knew the importance of helping each other.

Recommendations : We succeeded in developing more children who could take an action for mutual helping.

These points below can be the critical reasons that led to the success.

- We first let the children understand how the other team members. We let the children carry on understanding the other members, getting aware of the difference in the members, and taking actions. This action by us brought the children establish good relationship in each team.(mutual understanding, compassion)
- 2. We let the children think of how the other group members changed after they took action to help the other group members. The children got aware of their good change. The children came to know the children themselves and the others became happy by their taking action to help each other. This result pointed to the further motivation for the children to keep taking action to help others. It also caused the children's voluntary action. (do your duty)
- 3. We let the children make a declaration for mutual helping, which managed to hold them accountable for thinking about mutual helping with their team members. (do your duty)
- 4. We created an ideal environment that made it easy for the children to help each other, which should have been the one that each children couldn't create alone or achieve alone.

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In addition, our members, volunteer members, and local university students also found it important to have mutual understanding and compassion while they developed the children into human resources who can positively help others. They succeeded in becoming aware of the importance to develop not only children but also adults into such human resources.

We tried to make the parents involved in the program because it expected them to help the children take an action for mutual helping, and encouraged them to shift themselves to Positive Change. However, in fact, the target that we held 'walking 77 kilometers' had so strong impact that most of the parents couldn't help paying their attention to 'accomplishment'.

Participant survey from the parents showed that 40 percent parents talked about accomplishment at the comment column in which the parents could write about anything freely.

We asked all the parents to attend the brief session and explained the target of the program to them.

Most the parents seemed to understand the purpose of the program. However, there should be some room to reconsider how to make sure of the parents' understanding or how to let the parents involved in the program.

The excerptions from the survey from which we reached the conclusion above

They(the children) learned something: you can make it unless you stop it, not giving up is very important.


They(the children) seemed to become mentally/physically strong.





