Overview: [2012] Launched the "Okhotsk Kitami Students Union". Formed by the city's high school students, to think and act out what can be done to the region, a high school student of regional development organizations.

> [Aug. 2012] They are for the first time organized a local contribution program "Kitami Onion Festival", was held with the assistance of the JCI Kitami. Citizens about 400 people were visitors to the big event.

Since then, to continue its activities, it has continued up to now.

[2015] They carried out a total of 14 meetings, they conducted a "Nature **Experience Kids Adventure**", which is the training over three days, which was the subject of the city elementary school children in August. Also with the cooperation of local FM radio station, it gave a student FM broadcasting.

Results: 1. The young people were interested in the region to live in and were able to have a love for one's hometown mind.

- 2. The young people knew pleasure and trouble of the social development and came to want to be concerned with social development.
- 3. Young people had a sense of ownership as a mainstay of the regional future.
